

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS These requirements are included with the Street Opening Permit and made a part thereof.

1. All street opening work shall comply with the provisions of Chapter 262, Article VI, §262-42 through §262-58 of the City Code of the City of Lancaster; adopted as Article 913 of the Codified Ordinances (formerly Ordinance No. 11-1975). See Item 6 below.
2. Work may not begin prior to the effective date.
3. This permit may be revoked at any time in accordance with Chapter 262, Article VI, §262-49 (formerly Ordinance No. 11-1975, Section 913.08).
4. Total fee amount must be paid by check or money order made payable to the City of Lancaster.
5. Fee will be adjusted in accordance with actual opening area.
6. Copies of Chapter 262, Article VI will be furnished upon request or may be found at <http://www.cityoflancasterpa.com/> by accessing the "View the City Code" link.
7. Any requests for time extensions shall comply with the procedure in Chapter 262, Article VI, §262-50 (formerly Ordinance No. 11-1975, Section 913.09).
8. **No excavation or demolition may be performed without compliance with the PA 1-Call System Rules, Regulations and Procedures.** The permittee shall be responsible for the verification of all utility locations prior to work in accordance with the Pennsylvania One Call System and Pa Act 287. Information may be found at <http://www.pa1call.org/>. One Call notification shall be made by calling **811 or 1 800 242 1776. 3 Days Notice Is The Law!**
9. Prior to any blasting, a Blasting Permit shall be obtained from the Bureau of Fire.
10. If the street opening is an emergency, provide written certification as to the nature of the emergency within 5 days as per Chapter 262, Article VI, §262-43, B. of the City Code of the City of Lancaster.
11. The Permittee shall be fully responsible at all times for maintaining a safe work site for his workers and the public and for the maintenance and protection of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. Permittee is directed in part to the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) (see <http://mutcd.fhwa.dot.gov/>).
12. The City will track the condition of street restorations for such time as is necessary to assure compliance with Chapter 262, Article VI, §262-57 of the City Code of the City of Lancaster, "Guaranty of Work". This period of time shall be no less than 24 months.
13. The Department of Public Works may deny permits for work within a five year period after street resurfacing (Article V, 262-44 of the City Code of the City of Lancaster).
14. The Department of Public Works reserves the right to deny the issuance of future street opening permits to any person who violates the provisions of the Street Excavations ordinance (Article VI, 262-58 of the City Code of the City of Lancaster).
