#2020-13 Emergency Power Upgrade for the Conestoga and Susquehanna Water Treatment Plants

The City of Lancaster, PA will receive sealed proposals online for City of Lancaster Emergency Power Upgrade for the Conestoga and Susquehanna Water Treatment Plants for the Bureau of Water until Thursday, December 10, 2020 at 11:00AM at which time they shall be opened electronically and publicly posted on PennBid's website. The City of Lancaster is seeking proposals from qualified Contractors to perform the installation of emergency diesel generators at the City of Lancaster's Conestoga and Susquehanna Water Treatment Plants, and at the Susquehanna Low Service Pump Station. This contract will be awarded as a General and Electrical Prime. There will be a Mandatory Pre-Proposal held on Wednesday, December 2, 2020. This project is being funded, in part, with federal funds. Contractors are required to demonstrate the Six Good Faith Efforts to identify and solicit DBE firms for procurement of project construction, equipment, services, and supplies.

All bidders must ensure that employee and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, creed, color, ethnic or national origin, sex, age, or religion.

Notice is hereby given that this Project is funded by the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST), subject to the Davis Bacon Act of March 3, 1931, as amended, and that wages must be paid by contractors according to the U.S. Labor Department's Wage Decision (a copy of which is included in the Specifications), and Federal Executive Orders 11625, 12138 and 12432. It is also subject to EPA Regulations located at 40 CFR Part 33 requiring the detailed documentation of solicitation of disadvantaged business enterprises.

The City of Lancaster, PA reserves the right to reject any and all Bids and to accept the Bid, which is in the best interest of the City. The lowest responsible bidder need not be the bidder submitting the lowest dollar amount bid. The City may also consider the quality of the goods or services supplied, ease of repair, compatibility with other City equipment, responsiveness, past performance of the bidder and any other reasonable factors specified in the bid package.
