The City of Lancaster, PA will receive proposals online for the Howard Ave. Street Revitalization Project until May 12th, 2021 at 11:00AM at which time they shall be opened electronically and publicly posted on Penn Bid's website. The City of Lancaster is seeking bids from PennDOT Pre-qualified Prime/Subcontractors for curb and sidewalk repairs, ADA ramp installations, mill/overlay, pavement markings and tree pit preparation/installation. All documents and solicitation details are available online at no cost on PennBid- www.PennBid.net.

Notice is hereby given to bidders that this project is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and is subject to the Davis-Bacon Act of March 3, 1931, as amended, and wages must be paid by contractors according to the U.S. Labor Department's Wage Decision included in the specifications; provisions of Section 3 of the Housing Act of 1968; the President's Executive Order 11246 or any other order which prohibits discrimination in employment. All bidders must comply with the requirements of the Federal Labor Standards.

This Project and Contract are subject to certain special requirements. For example, as more specifically detailed in the Contract Documents, the successful bidder shall be required to assure protection against discrimination for employees, applicants for employment, and subcontractors on the grounds of actual or perceived race, color, sex, religion, ancestry, genetic information, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, familial status, marital status, age, mental or physical disability, use of guide or support animals and/or mechanical aids, and to make payment of certain minimum salaries and wages.

The City of Lancaster, PA reserves the right to reject any and all Bids or to accept the Bid, which is in the best interest of the City. The lowest responsible bidder need not be the bidder submitting the lowest dollar amount bid. The City may also consider the quality of the goods or services supplied, ease of repair, compatibility with other City equipment, responsiveness, past performance of the bidder and any other reasonable factors specified in the bid package.
